

Born a lowly tavern keeper's son, Cromwell rose swiftly through the ranks to become the king's right-hand man and one of the most powerful figures in Tudor history. The architect of England's break with the Roman Catholic Church and the dissolution of the monasteries, he was reviled for years as a Machiavellian schemer who stopped at nothing in his quest for power. But Thomas Cromwell was also a loving husband, father and guardian, a witty and generous host, and a loyal and devoted servant. With new insights into Cromwell's character, his family life and his close relationships with both Cardinal Wolsey and Henry VIII, Tracy Borman examines the life, loves and legacy of the man who changed the shape of England forever.
