

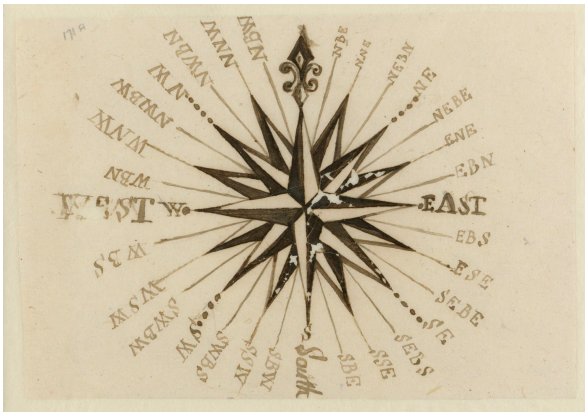

**Encountering the
Uncharted and Back –
Three explorers: Ball,
Vancouver and Burton**

This exhibition will highlight aspects of the adventurous work in the field of exploration of George Vancouver and Sir Richard Burton (both of whom lived and were buried in the Borough of Richmond), and of the naval commander Rear Admiral Henry Lidgbird Ball also buried in the Borough. The exhibition will examine their contribution to an increased European understanding of distant continents in the 18th and 19th centuries, including their encounters with native cultures, and will trace the varying fortunes of their reputations; how they were perceived during their lives, and posthumously, and how they came to all be buried in the Borough.
